What is the GLA?

Mission

Since 1935, the Geneva Lake Association (GLA) has served as a guardian of Geneva Lake and its surrounding area. GLA's mission is to help inform and educate its membership on a variety of topics related to the conservation, preservation, environmental integrity, and general welfare of Geneva Lake. GLA advances its mission by providing timely and issue-centered communications to a wide membership base of area residents and local businesses.

GLA services and benefits include

- Attentive monitoring of Geneva Lake area issues and concerns through the GLA Executive Secretary and its 27-member Board of Directors
- Annual publication of the GLA Directory of residents and pier numbers distributed to nearly 600 member families and businesses
- Annual updating of the GLA-established pier numbering system as a cross reference guide (pier numbers to street address) to enhance Lake safety and for emergency use by the Water Safety Patrol, police, ambulance, and fire departments around the Lake
- Periodic distribution to members and friends of the GLA-produced newsletter,
 the Geneva Lake Guardian
- Sponsoring the GLA Annual Meeting each summer to provide a forum for members to hear directly from local leaders and stakeholders who address current issues affecting the Lake

Background

During its 88-year history, GLA has grown to a broad membership of residents and businesses representing every village, association, inlet, bay and shore path around Geneva Lake. Residents on and off the Lake look to the GLA as one of the lake-wide organizations in place to keep residents current on issues of common concern or interest.

Because of the size of the area and the wide, varied interests of its growing population, the GLA Board includes 27 volunteer Directors from all corners of the Lake. This group, plus several retired (Honorary) Directors, the GLA Officers and its Executive Secretary form the GLA governing structure.

GLA's foundation is its dues-paying membership base, which is the only organization of its kind around the Lake and is the sole source of its financial support. All contributions are tax deductible as the GLA is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization

under IRS and State regulations. GLA carries out its responsibilities with a paid parttime Executive Secretary working within an operating budget to provide services and benefits to its growing membership.

GLA will continue to serve and support the interests of the wider Geneva Lake community through coordinated relationships with other Lake-serving groups whose missions are compatible, such as the Geneva Lake Water Safety Patrol, the Geneva Lake Environmental Agency, the Kishwauketoe Nature Conservancy, the Geneva Lake Conservancy, the Geneva Lake Level Corporation, the Water Alliance for Preserving Geneva Lake, and the GLA affiliated Environmental Education Foundation.

What has GLA done for me lately?

The following are a few good examples of GLA participation through communication and education in events of significant importance to Geneva Lake over the years:

- Providing financial support for various cover crop experiments to help local farmers reduce phosphorus runoff to the Lake
- Taking the lead in preventing commercial use of the lake shore path
- Revising and posting rules and signage for use of the lake shore path, in coordination with selected property owners and, in the future, the municipalities
- Helping with the financing and acquisition of the CD3 equipment, as part
 of a multi-agency experiment to reduce invasive species from entering the
 Lake by making this boat cleaning machine available for use at municipal
 launches
- Securing funding for a Fire Boat for Linn Township to provide additional support to all area Fire Departments
- Supporting the efforts of the Geneva Lake Level Corporation to maintain the lake's water level
- Participating in the successful Lake-wide initiative to prevent efforts to turn the Yerkes Observatory property into a large scale Lake front hotel/spa complex with potential environmental and land/lake conservation damage resulting
- The ongoing 45-year affiliation with its sister organization, the Environmental Education Foundation, as it provides scholarships and grants to Lake area students for environmental-centered studies and experiences
- Providing an annual forum each summer for members to hear from local leaders on current issues related to property trends, water quality, boating safety and area-wide conservation efforts, among other topics
- Participating in improved coordination activities among a multitude of local organizations to facilitate sharpened and streamlined responses to issues of current concern
- Keeping the membership current about the ongoing efforts of the Southeast Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission to revise the Geneva Lake Management Plan (last updated in 2008) (new Plan expected in 2024-25)

GLA ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

Saturday, August 6, 2022 Lake Geneva Country Club Lake Geneva, Wisconsin 9:30 a.m.

WELCOME – President Lillie called the meeting to order at 9:33 a.m., recognizing the directors and officers in attendance. Lillie thanked the membership for their support and their attendance. He noted that it seemed the lake fared well so far this season, use of the lake was down a bit, but issues of water quality and lake use remain in the forefront of the GLA's concerns, which will be addressed in various ways during the meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION – EEF President Bill Thompson noted that twelve local scholars had received scholarships from EEF in 2022, and introduced ten of those who were able to attend. Deadline for high school, undergraduate and graduate scholarship applications is March 1 each year.

MINUTES FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING, AUGUST 21, 2021 – A motion to approve the minutes as published was passed unanimously (Stuhley/Kenny).

NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORTS – The Nominating Committee proposed the following slates, which were approved unanimously:

EEF Directors for three-year terms ending in 2025: Casey Burmeister (first term), Brigid Cashman (first term), John Olson (first term), and Chuck Palma (second term). These were approved on a motion by Voris.

GLA Directors with three-year terms to expire in 2025: Brigid Cashman, Robert T. Morava, Jr., Paul Darley, Brian Griffith, Thomas Nickols, Karl Otzen, James W. McAvoy, Dana Hagenah, William B. Duncan. These were approved (Thompson/Gardiner).

Retiring GLA Treasurer Randolph was thanked, and new Board Member Darley was introduced.

LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVES

Senator Stephen Nass noted that although the legislature is not in session, the rules committee remains active year round to review any rules submitted by administration. There will be a vote on rules submitted for the treatment of invasive species next week.

Because of redistricting, *Representative Tyler August* now serves all of the communities around Geneva Lake, a region that he formerly shared with Representative Amy Loudenbeck. August serves on the Rules Committee mentioned by Nass. Unless challenged by the rules committee, administrative rules carry the force of law. Both he and Nass consistently remind fellow legislators that Geneva Lake is very different from most all other lakes in Wisconsin, and lake use rules often need to be modified for the local conditions. August has helped the Water Safety Patrol and Geneva Lake Law Enforcement to modify such rules.

Williams Bay and Fontana Village Presidents Bill Duncan and Pat Kenny spoke about actions their communities are taking for the health of the lake. Duncan described an ambitious plan to move Southwick Creek away from Highway 67 and into the Kishwauketoe Conservancy. This would decrease salt and other contaminants from entering the creek, and

the elimination of a culvert would aid the fish trying to make it upstream to their spawning areas. Controlling run-off from a nearby gravel pit is ongoing and is an important part of the realignment of the creek.

Kenny, who is also the new chairman of the Geneva Lake Environmental Agency, noted that Fontana has made numerous improvements in water retention, including a number of retention ponds and 24 roadside dry wells. Abbey Springs has expanded wet ponds, and efforts are underway to slow down the Pottawatomi Creek to decrease the sediment that flows into the Abbey Harbor. The Village has many more plans and hopes to accomplish two each year.

Fontana and Williams Bay are joining together to share seven full time EMTs.

AFFILIATED ASSOCIATION REPORTS

Geneva Lake Water Safety Patrol —Ted Pankau and Brigid Cashman spoke on issues affecting the WSP. Pankau noted that traffic this year was down a little, after the two busiest years in recent history. Pankau cautions boaters who swim off the boats and don't realize the speed by which a boat can get away in high winds, noting that drownings have occurred when people get separated from the boat. The Patrol's "Clip Before You Dip" campaign encourages boaters to don the PFDs before jumping off the boat for a swim.

Brigid Cashman noted the drowning of an 81 year-old paddle-boarder. Wisconsin requires paddle boards to have a PFD aboard, but does not require them to be worn. An observer or spotter is no longer required for skiing or other sports where a passenger is being towed in the state of Wisconsin. However, individual municipalities can require a 3rd person observer through a stricter ordinance, as is mandated by the Joint ordinance of the 4 municipalities of Geneva Lake. In addition, the state of Wisconsin does not require a skier to wear a PFD (personal flotation device) or life jacket while being towed. However, through our local ordinance, one is required on anyone being towed here on Geneva Lake. PFDs must be worn on PWCs (wave runners). Modern, less cumbersome inflatable belts are now approved, but only if being worn.

Geneva Lake Law Enforcement Agency – Commander Tom Hausner noted that finding staff for lake patrols in the summer is harder than usual, but that the Agency is still covering the lake as best as it can. Over 160 citations are normally written each year. The July 4 weekend is the busiest of the year, and with the help of the DNR, five patrol boats were able to write many citations and warnings for bad behavior on the water. Hausner noted a huge increase in wake board boats and many related complaints about noise, both engine and music. Until all four lake communities agree on an ordinance, the GLLEA can do little in this area.

Geneva Lake Environmental Agency — Director Jacob Schmidt noted that state law requires all boats and trailers be free from aquatic plants. The GLEA has attendants at all five launches to inform boaters of the rules. A recent ordinance was passed that will forward monies collected from ticketed violations to the affected lakes area. The GLEA will be conducting its annual boat count. The DNR has a tip line for those who witness abuses such as leaves, etc. being raked into the lake. The CD3 Boat Cleaning machine moves among the various launch sites. GLEA President Kenny hopes that each launch site will have its own boat cleaning station one day.

Water Alliance for Preserving Geneva Lake — Charles Colman related the history and goals of the Water Alliance, which started three years ago, not as a new organization, of which there are already many, but as a medium for representatives from all of the organizations to meet, share, and coordinate ideas. The group has representatives from EEF, GLA, GLC, GLEA, DNR, SEWRPC, UW, and other entities, all interested in preserving the quality of Geneva Lake. It is administratively supported by the Geneva Lake Conservancy.

Colman listed a number of accomplishments of the Water Alliance, including following issues:

- Williams Bay gravel piT
- Southwick Creek realignment funding
- Shoreline buffer strips & rain gardens
- CD3 Boat Cleaning machine
- Testing of tributaries
- Identification of run-off issues
- SEWRPC mapping of creeks
- Keeping it Blue community publications

Colman reports that the lake is healthy but under pressure from heavy rains in creeks, and boat wake damage to piers and shorelines. Funding is insufficient to address all of the issues.

ISSUES ON OTHER LAKES - Lynn Grayson reported on issues at Green Lake, Wisconsin and North Lake Wisconsin. Green Lake was determined to be 'impaired" in 2014 and has a large dead zone area where insufficient oxygen cannot support fish and healthy plant life. After a 3 year study, the Green Lake Association has embarked on an aggressive plan to decrease the phosphorus contamination that produced the dead zone, blue algae, and duckweed infestations. A very informative video produced by the Green Lake Association is available on our web site, and should encourage us to be proactive with Geneva Lake.

North Lake did an extended study on the impact of wake boat waves on sub surfaces of the lake, and found the effect was detrimental to the habitat of healthy aquatic growth, allowing invasive species to take hold in their stead. North Lake is trying to pass a 'hazardous wake ordinance.' Information on their two year study is also on our web site.

REAL ESTATE MARKET TRENDS - Bob Rauland, from Berkshire-Hathaway Realty, formerly the Rauland Agency, highlighted real estate market trends especially those related to lakefront and lake access houses. Bob provided a hand out with current statistics and maps of Walworth County lakes. The handout was available in the room, and copies are available from the Rauland Agency.

The average price of an improved lakefront property so far this year (there have been 14) is \$4,600,000 plus, at an average of \$45,368 per lake front foot. Rauland was thanked for his forty some years of reporting at the GLA Annual Meetings and given a special gift in gratitude for his years of service.

There being no further reports, President Lillie adjourned the meeting at 11:04 a.m. (Duncan/Kenny)

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION, Mission

The mission of the EEF is to award educational scholarships and grants to area students and schools for environmental-centered studies and to promote environmental awareness to all ages of the Geneva Lake area.

See page 70 for the EEF By-Laws.

The Environmental Education Foundation (EEF) was founded in 1980 as an affiliate of the Geneva Lake Association. Past EEF Presidents Thomas E. Reynolds, Sr. and Fillmore W. Galaty, recognized an opportunity to promote environmental education by offering scholarships and environmental experiences to Geneva Lake area youth. This led to the formation of the Environmental Education Foundation as a tax exempt 501(c) (3) affiliate of the Geneva Lake Association.

During its more than 40-year history, the EEF has awarded more than half a million dollars in college scholarships and outdoor education grants benefiting more than 500 area students and schools, from 5th grade through graduate school.

Scholarship Changes and Expansion in 2022-2023

In 2022, the foundation funded the environmentally focused college education of a dozen area students. In 2023, that number will rise to fourteen and that financial support will rise as well. Thanks to the generosity of the EEF founding family, the Reynolds, the Thomas E. Reynolds scholarship award has increased to \$16,000.

Another first in 2023 is the **award of the Thomas E. Reynolds Jr. Gateway Technical College Scholarship.** High School students in the Geneva Lake area can now apply for support for associate degrees and certifications that prepare them for environmentally focused professions. This year the foundation will invest in the education of technical college,

undergraduate, and even post-graduate students.

Also in 2023, principals and leadership teams from the area high schools engaged with board members to improve scholarship programs and processes. Improvements included creating a new website, streamlining the online application, and working with high school leaders to inform students about the scholarships and equip them to apply.



Thomas E. Reynolds Scholarship Winners

Each year the foundation awards a four-year scholarship to the top high school scholarship applicant. A new Reynolds scholar will be announced this spring. The 2022 winner, Amanda Bender, is studying Plant Pathology at UW-Madison. The 2021 scholar, Ave Beyers studies Geo and Environmental Science at Carthage College. Melissa Konkle was awarded

the scholarship in 2019 and Microbiology and Dairy Science at UW Madison.

Those winners are then supported for four years of undergraduate study. EEF President Bill Thompson celebrating these scholars noted, "These students should be an inspiration to all of us and give us great hope for the continued health of our Geneva Lake environment."







LAKE SHORE PATHS

The Lake Shore path on Geneva Lake has existed for more than 100 years. There seems to be no specific judicial ruling as to the status of this Lake Shore path. It is believed to consist of an easement in favor of the public, and upon this basis the following answers are offered:

Question: Where does this easement exist?

Answer: It exists only upon the location in which it has been used without change or variation for the prescriptive period of twenty years, provided by our statute, although a slight variation at a given point will not impair such rights.

Question: Does an owner of property have a right to materially alter its course or character, even if such alteration be of public benefit?

Answer: No. If, however, an owner does make such change and if the public continues in the use of the easement in its altered condition for a length of time sufficient to show acquiescence in the change, effective complaint cannot afterward be made because of the change.

Change in a structure, however, which does not impair the easement but tends to ornament it, does not constitute any violation of the right owed by the owner to the public.

Where the owner alters the location of the easement, as to its direction and grade, such as the case where he deflects it from its original course and causes it to descend a bank, possibly supplying steps or some other means, although the user of the easement is not obliged to travel upon the path as changed, he may do so, and when he does so, it is by the license or implied consent of the owner.

There seems to be no duty of an owner toward a license, beyond the avoidance of any active, willful act, structure or contrivance which might injure the license.

Question: Can an owner be held liable for one injured by a danger concealed only by the darkness of night?

Answer: No. It is, however, strongly recommended that in case of changes made by owners as to the surface, course or level of the path crossing his property, it be so supplied so that travel thereon be not more hazardous than that part of the path discontinued. Proper guard rails are suggested.

It is very dangerous to prescribe limitations on liability and to define corresponding rights as applied to any specific instance. The above statements are on the general principles involving the relative rights of the public and liabilities of owners of Lake Shore property.

The following answers to questions are based on the opinion of legal counsel:

Question: Is Geneva Lake a navigable lake?

Answer: Yes. It is so designated by Government Survey.

Question: In whom does title rest?

Answer: Title to the bed of the lake is vested in the State of Wisconsin, which holds title as trustee for the public to the end of maintaining and preserving the rights of the public in navigation thereof.

Question: What are the riparian owner's rights?

Answer: Riparian owners own their land on a navigable lake in fee simple down to low water mark. Their rights are based on their ownership and title to the banks. This ownership gives to them the exclusive privilege to the shore for the purpose of access to their land and the water. These rights include the right of using the shore for the building of piers extending into the water beyond low water mark, walls to prevent loss of soil by erosion, waves, etc.

Question: What rights and control does a riparian owner have over his private pier?

Answer: Private piers constructed and abutting on the private shore property constitute the sole and private property of the owner of the adjoining land; such owner is as free to prohibit the entrance upon such pier of unauthorized persons (except in emergency of storms, distress, etc.) as he is to deny his home to them. His dominion and control over the shore line is of the same nature, subject only to the right of navigation over the waters of the lake.

Question: May an unauthorized person moor a boat near a private pier and may he make a landing on private property?

Answer: No unauthorized person may moor a boat or a raft in front of private property in any manner that might interfere with reasonable navigation, to and from such property at any time. It is believed that the choice of an owner or his authorized friends as to the course of water ingress to or ingress from the property should rest entirely with the owner or his friends so using the property. Owner of such private property may notify any unauthorized person to remove such boat or raft, or may remove such boat or raft or cause same to be removed, in a manner not doing more harm to the boat than must necessarily result from its act of removal. Care should be exercised by the owner to avoid unreasonable action in the matter and to avoid further any manner of carrying out the removal of the boat from which malice could be inferred.

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BY LAWS OF ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.

ARTICLE ONE - NAME, OFFICE AND PURPOSE

- 1.01 The name of the corporation is "THE ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC."
- 1.02 The corporation shall maintain in the State of Wisconsin a registered office and a registered agent at such office, and may have other offices within or without the state. The principal office of the corporation shall be in the Geneva Lake area.
- 1.03 The purposes of the corporation are as follows:
 - (1) To provide scholarships or awards to qualified high school, college and graduate students, with preference to those who attend or attended a high school located in the Geneva Lake area, and who have demonstrated significant interest in an environmental science and intend to further their study in the field.
 - (2) To provide scholarships to qualified high school students at the same high schools described above who will attend field courses offered by Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources or similar short courses. Also, to provide scholarships to qualified grade school students in the school districts in which the high schools described above are located, who will attend field courses in the nature camps offered by the Wisconsin DNR and the University of Wisconsin System.
 - (3) To administer all gifts and grants of money or property, real or personal, by corporations, partnerships, and natural persons for the purpose of providing such scholarships.
 - (4) To do all and everything necessary to accomplish the purposes herein before mentioned either alone or in association with other individuals, corporations or partnerships, including federal, state, county, and municipal bodies and in general, to do any and all things which a natural person could do, or which now or hereafter may be authorized by law, and in general to do or perform such acts and transact such business in connection with the foregoing purposes, which are not inconsistent with
 - (5) If, in any one year, after all of the scholarships and expenses have been covered, and there is a surplus of funds available, the Corporation may vote to financially support a program, project or activity that will promote environmental education and/or create awareness to environmental issues in the Geneva Lake Area.
- 1.04 It is intended that awards be made annually. Potential recipients may apply to the corporation for awards or they may be nominated by others who know of their qualifications. Recipients shall be of good to excellent academic standing, and they shall have demonstrated an interest in the environmental sciences and intend to further their study in an environmental field. They shall be recommended by the appropriate committees of their respective schools and may be interviewed by the members of the Geneva Lake Association. Presentation of the awards shall be made by a member of the Geneva Lake Association or by an appropriate designee. The amounts of the awards shall be decided annually by the Board of Directors. While it is intended that awards shall be made annually, it should be realized that if suitable recipients are not available or if the corporation does not have sufficient funds, awards may not be made in some years.

ARTICLE TWO - MEMBERS

2.01 The Corporation shall have no members. The Board of Directors shall be elected by the members of Geneva Lake Association, Inc., from among its members at the annual meeting of the Association.

ARTICLE THREE - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 3.01 The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors.
- 3.02 The number of directors shall be established from time to time at any annual or regular meeting, or at a special meeting called for that purpose, but in no event shall the number of directors at any time be less than nine(9) nor more than fifteen (15).
- 3.03 The members of the Board of Directors shall be elected for terms of three (3) years each, with one-third (1/3) of the directors being elected each year. No directors shall serve more than two (2) complete terms consecutively, and must remain off of the Board of Directors for at least one (1) year before thereafter being reelected.
- 3.04 The President of the Geneva Lake Association, and the Executive Director of the Geneva Lake Environmental Agency, shall both be ex officio members of the Board of Directors, serving without election. Anything otherwise set out herein to the contrary notwithstanding, each of such President's and Executive Director's terms as a member of the Board shall coincide with, and terminate automatically upon the expiration of his/her term as President or Executive Director. Said members shall further have all rights and responsibilities of a Director of the Corporation including, but not limited to, the right to vote upon all matters coming before the Board.
- 3.05 Any person having served with distinction as a Director of the Foundation may be considered for service as an Honorary Director of the Foundation subject to election by the Board. Any person so elected will hold the title of Honorary Director and has the responsibility to be an ambassador for the Foundation supporting the Foundation and its programs with his or her contacts in the Geneva Lake Area. An Honorary Director may attend and participate in meetings of the Board but will not have a vote.
- 3.06 A regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be scheduled for and held during the month of July of each calendar year. Notice of the annual meeting shall be given to the members of the board in the manner and in the time as provided in Section 3.07 below. It is anticipated that said annual meeting shall take place no earlier than fourteen (14) days before nor later than the day of the Geneva Lake Association annual meeting. The Board of Directors may provide by resolution the time and place, for the holding of additional regular meetings of the board without other notice than such resolution.
- 3.07 Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of any Director. The Director who calls a special meeting may fix any place as the place for holding such special meeting. Said notice shall, to the extent required by Wisconsin law, shall also include the purpose of such meeting.
- 3.08 Unless a greater time is required by Wisconsin law, notice of any special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given at least five (5) days prior thereto by written notice to each Director at his address as shown on the records of the corporation. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States Mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage prepaid. Notice of any meeting of the Board of Directors may be

waived in writing signed either before or after the time of the meeting. The attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Directors attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Except as provided above, neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board need be specified in the notice of such meeting.

- 3.09 Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors may be filled by the remaining directors. A Director appointed to fill a vacancy shall hold office until his successor shall have been elected by the members of the Geneva Lake Association, Inc. in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.01 above.
- 3.10 A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board, provided that if less than a majority of the Directors are present, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting to another time without further notice.
- 3.11 Any action which may be taken by the Board at a meeting may also be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken, is signed by one hundred percent (100%) of all of the directors then in office. Actions pursuant to such a written consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of the Board, and shall be effective when the last director signs the consent (or upon such other effective date as specified in the consent).
- 3.12 The Board of Directors may permit any or all directors to participate in a regular or special meeting, or in a committee meeting, of the Board of Directors by, and may conduct such meeting through, the use of any means of communication by which any of the following occurs:
 - (1) all participating directors may simultaneously hear or read each others' communications during the meeting; or
 - (2) all communication during the meeting is immediately transmitted to each participating director, and each participating director is able to immediately send messages to all other participating directors.

If a meeting will be conducted under this section, all participating directors shall be informed that a meeting is taking place at which official business may be transacted.

A director participating in a meeting conducted in a manner described in this section is deemed to be present in person at the meeting. If requested by a director, minutes of the meeting shall be prepared and distributed to each director. All rules applicable to regular or special meetings of the Board shall apply to a meeting satisfying the communication and other requirements set out in this Section, and all actions shall have the same force and effect as if taken at a meeting at which all of the Directors were present in person.

ARTICLE FOUR - OFFICERS

4.01 The officers of the corporation shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers as the Board may from time to time deem necessary. The Board of Directors may provide for appointment of such additional officers as they may deem in the best interest of the corporation. Any two offices may be held by the same person, except the officers of the President and Secretary. The officers shall perform such additional or different duties as shall from time to time be imposed or required by the Board of Directors, or as may be prescribed from time to time by the bylaws.

- 4.02 The officers shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors. Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office for one year or until his successor shall have been duly elected, and shall have qualified. Election of an officer shall not of itself create contract rights.
- 4.03 Any officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the corporation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.
- 4.04 The President shall be the principal executive officer in all activities and transactions of the organization and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall have general supervision of the affairs of the corporation.
- 4.05 The Vice-President shall discharge the duties of the President in the event of the absence or disability for any cause whatsoever of the latter.
- 4.06 The Secretary shall record the minutes of the meeting of the members and the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose. The Secretary shall countersign all deeds, leases and conveyances executed by the corporation, affix the seal of the corporation thereto, and to such other papers as shall be required or directed to be sealed. The Secretary shall be custodian of the corporation records, except the books and records as incidental to the duties of the Treasurer; and shall see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws or as required by law.
- 4.07 The Treasurer shall keep and account for all money, credits and property, of any and every kind, of the corporation, which shall come into his hands, and keep an accurate account of all money received and disbursed and proper vouchers for money disbursed, and to render such accounts, any statements received and disbursed, and of money and property on hand, and generally of all matters pertaining to his office, as shall be required by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE FIVE – COMMITTEES

- 5.01 The Board of Directors shall have the authority to appoint one or more committees as the need arises.
- 5.02 Thomas E. Reynolds Endowment Fund Committee
 - (1) A permanent Thomas E. Reynolds Endowment Fund Committee will be appointed by the Board of Directors consisting of three (3) members. The tenure of this committee will be open for a change any time. If a vacancy occurs or a change must be made, the Board of Directors will handle.
 - (2) This Committee will consist of:
 - 1. A member of the Thomas E. Reynolds family.
 - 2. A qualified high school administrator or teacher.
 - A qualified individual, if possible, who has had experience in the interviewing of students and who is interested in the preservation and conservation of our natural resources and environment.
 - (3) The responsibility of this committee will be to interview the selected winners in each of the four (4) high schools and choose one (1) qualified graduate for a four (4) year scholarship, renewable annually subject to review, at an accredited university such as The College of Natural Resources, University of Wisconsin/Stevens Point.
 - (4) The student chosen must express a desire to complete a four (4) year course in the College of Natural Resources and to follow this career as a lifework.

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- (5) The amount of this scholarship will be determined by the Board of Directors. Payment will be made directly to the university by July 15 of the award year.
- (6) The candidate must supply the committee at the end of each school year the courses and grade, and his or her plans for the coming year. The committee will advise our Treasurer when to mail the checks to the universities.
- (7) The students must be advised of our requirements and should be asked to keep the committee chairman posted on their progress as well as current home and school addresses.

ARTICLE SIX - CONTRACTS, CHECKS, DEPOSITS AND FUNDS

- 6.01 The Board of Directors shall authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of or on behalf of the corporation and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- 6.02 All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation shall be signed such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolutions of the Board of Directors. In the absence of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President or the Vice-President of the corporation.
- 6.03 All funds of the corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.
 - (1) The Thomas E. Reynolds Scholarship Endowment Fund must be established under a separate bank account of The Environmental Education Foundation, Inc.. The capital money in this fund cannot be used. It must be wisely invested and the income only be used for scholarships and, if necessary, for operating expense incurred by the special Endowment Fund Committee.
 - (2) The Environmental Education Foundation, Inc. will keep a separate checking account to handle the operating expense, overhead, and fund raising expense. Income for this account will come from fund raising letters as needed to the general public around the lake.
 - (3) Our secretary and treasurer must examine every gift to make sure the donor's money is deposited to the correct account
- 6.04 The Board of Directors are authorized to raise funds in order to accomplish its purpose by an appropriate means and may accept on behalf of the corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purpose of the corporation.
- 6.05 The members of the Board of Directors are authorized to reimburse themselves for expenses incurred for services rendered in the administration of the Corporation. In no event shall any director who has made a contribution to the Corporation receive compensation therefrom.

ARTICLE SEVEN - BOOKS, RECORDS AND FISCAL YEAR

7.01 The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors, and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors. All books and records of the corporation may be inspected by any Director or his agent or attorney for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

7.02 The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on July $1^{\rm st}$ and end the following June $30^{\rm th}$.

ARTICLE EIGHT - MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS

- 8.01 The corporation seal shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the words "Corporate Seal, Wisconsin."
- 8.02 Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of Wisconsin Nonstock Corporation Law or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or bylaws of the corporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.
- 8.03 The power to alter, amend or repeal the bylaws or adopt new bylaws shall be vested in the Board of Directors. Such action may be taken at any regular or special meeting. The bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the corporation not inconsistent with law or the Articles of Incorporation.
- 8.04 Indemnification and Liability.
 - (1) Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted or required by law, including but not limited to Wisconsin Statutes Sections 181.0871 through 181.0889 (and any subsequent amendments thereto), the Corporation shall indemnify its Directors and Officers against any and all Liabilities, damages, costs and Expenses and shall advance, as incurred, any and all reasonable Expenses, incurred in any Proceeding to which any such Director or Officer is a party because he or she is a Director or Officer of the Corporation, or because he or she is responsible for the operation of the Corporation or any part thereof. The rights granted herein shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to indemnification against Liabilities, damages, costs and Expenses, or the advancement of Expenses to which a Director or Officer may be entitled under any written agreement, board resolution, statute or otherwise. Further, all such rights shall continue as to any person who has ceased to be a Director or Officer, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of such person.
 - All capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meaning set forth in Section 181.0871 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
 - (2) Liability. Upon receipt of a request for indemnification against Liabilities and Expenses and/or advancement of Expenses pursuant to this provision, a prompt determination shall be made by a disinterested quorum of the Board, if available, or by such other means recognized by law, to determine the requesting Party's right to indemnification or advancement. If no such determination is made within thirty (30) days from the date of the request, it shall be conclusively presumed for all purposes that the requesting Party has rights to indemnification and for advancement unless, by proper resolution of the Board, said thirty (30) day deadline is extended. The Corporation may, but shall not be obligated or required to, supplement the foregoing rights to indemnification against Liability and Expenses, and/or advancement of Expenses by purchasing insurance on behalf of any one or more Directors or Officers, regardless of whether the Corporation shall be obligated to indemnify against Liability or advance Expenses to the Director or Officer covered by said insurance.

BY LAWS OF GENEVA LAKE ASSOCIATION, INC.

ARTICLE I NAME

<u>Section 1-1 - Name</u>: The name of the Corporation shall be THE GENEVA LAKE ASSOCIATION, INC. (the Association).

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

<u>Section 2-1 - Purpose</u>: Since 1935 the Geneva Lake Association has served as guardian of Geneva Lake and its surrounding area. The Geneva Lake Association advances its mission of conservation, preservation, environmental integrity and general welfare of Geneva Lake with timely and issue-centered communications and education through a wide membership base of area residents and local businesses.

<u>Section 2-2 - Revenue Code</u>: All activities of the Association will be conducted within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE III MEMBERS

- <u>Section 3-1 Eligibility</u>: Anyone interested in promoting the general welfare and conservation of the Geneva Lake Region is eligible for membership in the Association. There shall be six classes of membership in the Association.
- <u>Section 3-2 Regular Member</u>: A person making an annual contribution of \$40 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Regular Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-3 Sustaining Member</u>: A person making an annual contribution of \$75 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Sustaining Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-4 Contributing Member</u>: A person making an annual contribution of \$100 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Contributing Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-5 Donor Member</u>: A person making an annual contribution of \$150 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Donor Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-6 Benefactor Member</u>: A person making an annual contribution of \$250 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Benefactor Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-7 Commercial Member</u>: A corporation making an annual contribution of \$100 in support of the operations of the Association will be considered to be a Commercial Member of the Association.
- <u>Section 3-8 Redetermination of Member Classes and Contribution Levels</u>: The Board of the Association shall have the authority to revise the classes of Members, to add additional Member qualifications and to re-determine the annual contribution requirement for membership.
- <u>Section 3-9 Mail Address</u>: Each Member of the Association shall file with the Executive Secretary of the Association their permanent mailing address, their lake address, if different than their permanent mailing address and their e-mail address. All Notices shall be sent to the Member's e-mail address on file or if no e-mail address is on file to the Member's permanent mailing address on file. Any Member failing to provide his or her current e-mail

address and or permanent mailing address to the Executive Secretary shall forfeit his or her right to all Association mailings, to include Notice of all meetings.

<u>Section 3-10 - Removal of a Member</u>: Any Member who fails to make his or her annual contribution within the fiscal year, after written notice of such default has been given, shall automatically forfeit membership in the Association.

ARTICLE IV MEETING OF MEMBERS

- <u>Section 4-1 Annual Meeting:</u> The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Association shall be held on any Saturday during the months of July or August, at an hour and place to be determined by the Board.
- <u>Section 4-2 Special Meetings:</u> A Special Meeting of the Members of the Association may be called by the President, a majority of the Board or at the request of any twenty (20) Members of the Association.
- <u>Section 4-3 Meeting Notice</u>: Notice of a Meeting of the Members of the Association shall be sent to all Members of the Association at their e-mail address on file or, if an e-mail address is not on file, to their permanent mailing address, at least ten (10) days, but not more than fifty (50) days, prior to the meeting, stating the place, day and time of said meeting. In the case of a Special Meeting of Members of the Association, the purpose or purposes for which the Special Meeting of the Members of the Association has been called shall also be included in the Notice of the Meeting.
- <u>Section 4-4 Vote:</u> Each Member of the Association in good standing in attendance or represented by an authorized Proxy shall be entitled to one (1) vote on all issues considered at the Meeting of the Members of the Association.
- <u>Section 4-5 Quorum:</u> Twenty (20) Members of the Association shall constitute a quorum at a Meeting of the Members of the Association.
- <u>Section 4-6 Proxy:</u> Each Member entitled to vote at a Meeting of Members of the Association, or to express consent or dissent to an Association action in writing without a Meeting of Members of the Association taking place may authorize in writing another Member or Members to act on his/her behalf by Proxy. No such Proxy shall be valid after eleven (11) months from the date of execution unless the Proxy provides for a longer period of effectiveness.

ARTICLE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- <u>Section 5-1 General Powers</u>: The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors, (the Board).
- <u>Section 5-2 Number and Tenure</u>: The number of Directors shall be twenty-seven (27). The Board shall be elected by the Members at the Annual Meeting of the Association, except a past president shall serve three (3) years without election after the completion of his/her term of office. The members of the Board shall be elected for terms of three (3) years each. Nine (9) of the Directors shall be elected each year at the Annual Meeting of the Association.
- <u>Section 5-3 Non Voting Members</u>: The Executive Secretary shall serve as non voting member of the Board.
- <u>Section 5-4 Regular Meeting</u>: A Regular Meeting of the Board shall be held annually, without other notice than these bylaws, either before or after the Annual Meeting of the Members. The Board may provide by resolution the time and place for holding additional, regular meetings of the Board, with appropriate notice.

- <u>Section 5-5 Special Meeting</u>: Special Meetings of the Board may be called by the President, Vice President or any five (5) members of the Board. The person or persons authorized to call a Special Meeting of the Board may fix any place within the Geneva Lake Area as the place for holding any such meeting of the Board called by them.
- Section 5-6 Meeting Notice and Waiver: Notice of any Regular or Special Meeting of the Board shall be given at least five (5) days prior thereto by e-mail to each Director at his or her e-mail address, as shown on the records of the Association or, if specifically requested in writing by a Director, at his or her permanent mailing address, as shown on the records of the Association. Notice of any meeting of the Board may be waived in writing, signed either before or after the time of the meeting. The attendance of a Director at a meeting shall constitute a Waiver of Notice of such meeting, except when a Director attends a meeting for the expressed purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of any Regular or Special Meeting of the Board need be specified in the Notice of such meeting.
- <u>Section 5-7 Quorum</u>: Nine (9) members of the Board shall constitute a Quorum for the transaction of business at any Meeting of the Board, provided that if fewer than nine (9) of the Directors are present at such meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting to another time, with similar Notice of the adjourned meeting date.
- <u>Section 5-8 Resignation:</u> Except as otherwise required by law, a Director may resign from the Board at any time by giving notice in writing to the Board. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, and unless otherwise specified therein, no acceptance of such resignation shall be necessary to make it effective.
- <u>Section 5-9 Removal</u>: A Director may be removed by a majority vote of the Board at any Regular or Special Meeting of the Board whenever in the Board's judgment the best interests of the Association would be served by the removal of the Director.
- <u>Section 5-10 Vacancy</u>: Any vacancy occurring in the Board may be filled by the Board. A Director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.
- <u>Section 5-11 Electronic Voting:</u> Motions approved by the Executive Committee may be submitted electronically to the Board for their approval. Only one motion and appropriate supporting materials shall be sent to the Board for consideration at a time. The submission shall request an indication of Approval or Disapproval. The result of the electronic vote shall be recorded in the minutes of the next meeting of the Board.

ARTICLE VI HONORARY DIRECTORS

- <u>Section 6-1 Qualification:</u> Any person having served with distinction as a Director of the Association for a minimum of six (6) years and meeting the requirements set forth in ARTICLE III as a Member in good standing of the Association may be considered for service as an Honorary Director of the Association.
- <u>Section 6-2 Election</u>: Any past Director meeting the qualifications to serve as an Honorary Director may be elected as an Honorary Director at any meeting of the Board of the Association or by electronic vote by a majority vote of the Board. Any person so elected will hold the title of Honorary Director as long as he or she is a Member in good standing of the Association.
- <u>Section 6-3 Responsibilities:</u> An Honorary Director has the responsibility to be an ambassador for the Association supporting the Association and its programs with his or her contacts in the Geneva Lake Area. An Honorary Director may attend Meetings of the Board and with the prior approval of the President of the Association the Honorary Director may speak but will not have a vote.

ARTICLE VII

- <u>Section 7-1 Number of Officers</u>: The four (4) elected Officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the appointed officer of the Association shall be the Executive Secretary. The Board may from time to time deem it necessary to elect or appoint additional officers.
- <u>Section 7-2 Election and Term of Office</u>: Officers shall be elected annually by the Board at the Annual Meeting of the Board. Any two (2) offices of the Association may be held by the same person except the offices of President and Secretary. Each Officer shall hold office for one (1) year or until his or her successor has been elected. The President may not serve more than five (5) successive one-year terms. The election of an Officer shall not of itself create contract rights.
- <u>Section 7-3 Removal</u>: An Officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the Board when in the Board's judgment the best interests of the Association would be served by the removal of the Officer. Such removal shall be without prejudice to contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.
- <u>Section 7-4 Vacancies</u>: Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the Board. Officers so elected will serve until the next Annual Meeting of the Board.
- <u>Section 7-5 President</u>: The President shall be the principal executive officer in all activities and transactions of the Association and shall preside at all Meetings of the Members and the Board and shall be responsible for general supervision of all affairs of the Association.
- <u>Section 7-6 Vice President</u>: The Vice President shall discharge the duties of the President in the event of the absence or disability of the President. The Vice President shall perform any additional duties that may from time to time be directed by the Board.
- <u>Section 7-7 Secretary</u>: The Secretary shall record the minutes of meetings of the Members and of the Board in one or more books provided for that purpose. The Secretary shall countersign all deeds, leases, and conveyances executed by the Association, affix the seal of the Association on papers that are required to be sealed.
- <u>Section 7-8 Treasurer</u>: The Treasurer shall oversee the preparation of the annual budget, oversee all cash investment activities, and make recommendations as to financial institutions to be used by the Association.
- <u>Section 7-9 Executive Secretary</u>: The Executive Secretary shall be the custodian of the Association records, except the books and records incidental to the duties of the Treasurer, keep a register of the postal, e-mail and phone numbers of each Member and see that all Notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law. In addition the Executive Secretary shall perform any additional duties that may from time to time be directed by the Board.
- <u>Section 7-10 Additional Officers</u>: Additional Officers shall perform those duties that are assigned at the time the position is created by the Board.

ARTICLE VIII COMMITTEES

Section 8-1 - Executive Committee: The Executive Committee shall be made up of the Elected Officers of the Association, the Immediate Past President of the Association, and the Chairman of the Standing Committees of the Association. In addition, the Executive Secretary of the Association will serve as non-voting members of the Executive Committee. Five (5) members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum. The Executive Committee shall have the authority to take any action not inconsistent with these By-Laws. Minutes of all Executive Committee meetings shall be kept by the Association's Executive Secretary.

Section 8-2 - Standing Committees: The President of the Association shall appoint the members of each Standing Committee to include the Chair of each Standing Committee. Standing Committees shall be composed of no fewer than three Members of the Association, a majority of which are Directors of the Association. A simple majority of the members of a Standing Committee shall constitute a quorum. Each Standing Committee shall operate under procedures established in the committee's charter, approved by the Executive Committee. Minutes of all Standing Committee meetings will be prepared by a member of the Standing Committee and filed with the Executive Secretary. Standing Committees of the Association shall include, but not be limited to, Nominating, Finance, Membership, Commercial Membership, Mission, Land and Lake Use, Legal, Program and Publicity and Budget.

<u>Section 8-3 - Special Purpose Committees:</u> The President of the Association may appoint Special Purpose Committees consistent with the Purposes of the Association. Special Purpose Committees shall be composed of no fewer than three Members of the Association, a majority of which are Directors of the Association. A simple majority of the members of a Special Purpose Committee shall constitute a quorum. Each Special Purpose Committee shall operate under procedures established in the Special Purpose Committee's charter, approved by the Executive Committee. Minutes of all Special Purpose Committee meetings will be prepared by a member of the Special Purpose Committee and filed with the Executive Secretary.

<u>Section 8-4 - Electronic Voting</u>: Committee actions may be taken electronically if all materials supporting the action being taken have been provided to all committee members and actions taken are recorded in the official minutes of the committee.

ARTICLE IX FINANCIAL POLICIES, BUSINESS MATTERS and RECORDS

- <u>Section 9-1 Registered Office</u>: The Association shall maintain a registered office and a registered agent in the State of Wisconsin, and may have other offices within or without the state.
- <u>Section 9-2 Fiscal Year</u>: The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on July 1st of each year and end on the following June 30th.
- <u>Section 9-3 Banking Relationship</u>: All funds of the Association shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Board may from time to time select.
- <u>Section 9-4 Checks and Deposits</u>: All checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness, issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such Officer or Officers, agent or agents of the Association and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolutions of the Board. In absence of such determination by the Board, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the President, Vice President or Executive Secretary of the Association.
- <u>Section 9-5 Contracts</u>: The Board may authorize any Officer or Officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute or deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Association, and such authorization may be general or confined to specific instances.
- <u>Section 9-6 Loans</u>: No indebtedness for borrowed money shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no evidences of such indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by or under the authority of a resolution of the Board. Such authorization may be general or confined to specific instances.
- <u>Section 9-7 Acceptance of Cash Gifts, Non-Cash Gifts and Bequests</u>: The Board may accept on behalf of the Association any contribution, gift, bequest, or device, for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Association.

<u>Section 9-8 - Books and Records</u>: The Association shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Member, Board, and Committee meetings, and shall keep at the registered or principal office a record giving the names and addresses of the Members entitled to vote. All books and records of the Association may be inspected by any Member or his or her agent or attorney for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

<u>Section 9-9 - Corporate Seal</u>: The Board may provide a corporate seal that shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Association and the state of incorporation and the words "CORPORATE SEAL".

<u>Section 9-10 - Mandated Reserve</u>: In order to maintain the Association's financial stability and to prepare for unexpected contingencies, the Board aspires to establish and maintain a cash reserve (Reserve Account). The Reserve Account will be equal in amount to the prior eighteen (18) months' total cash disbursements (excluding discretionary grants). Such funds shall be recorded separately on the financial statements as the "Board Mandated Reserve". The Board shall review the size of the Reserve Account each year as part of the annual budgeting process. Draw downs from the Reserve Account shall require majority approval of the entire Board.

<u>Section 9-11 - Investment Policy</u>: The Association's primary objective in managing its investable assets is to preserve principal. However, the Board recognizes that during some market conditions, an all-cash policy may be inappropriate. Provided that the Reserve Account has been achieved, the Executive Committee is authorized to allocate no more than twenty-five (25) per cent of the Association's remaining investable assets in prudent, non-cash accounts. The Board shall review the allocation of the investments each year as a part of the annual budgeting process.

ARTICLE X INDEMNIFICATION and LIABILITY

Article 10-1 - Indemnification: To the fullest extent permitted or required by law, including but not limited to Wisconsin Statutes Sections 181.0871 through 181.0889 (and any subsequent amendments thereto), the Association shall indemnify its Directors and Officers against any and all Liabilities, damages, costs and Expenses and shall advance, as incurred, any and all reasonable Expenses, incurred in any Proceeding to which any such Director or Officer is a party because he or she is a Director or Officer of the Association, or because he or she is responsible for the operation of the Association or any part thereof. The rights granted herein shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to indemnification against Liabilities, damages, costs, and Expenses, or the advancement of Expenses to which a Director or Officer may be entitled under any written agreement, Board resolution, statute or otherwise. Further, all such rights shall continue as to any person who has ceased to be a Director or Officer, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of such person.

Article 10-2 - Liability: Upon receipt of a request for indemnification against Liabilities and Expenses and/or advancement of Expenses pursuant to this provision, a prompt determination shall be made by a disinterested quorum of the Board, if available, or by such other means recognized by law, to determine the requesting Party's right to indemnification or advancement. If no such determination is made within thirty (30) days from the date of the request, it shall be conclusively presumed for all purposes that the requesting Party has rights to indemnification and for advancement unless, by proper resolution of the Board, said thirty (30) day deadline is extended. The Association may, but shall not be obligated to, supplement the foregoing rights to indemnification against Liability and Expenses, and/or advancement of Expenses by purchasing insurance on behalf of any one or more Directors or Officers, regardless of whether the Association shall be obligated to indemnify against Liability or advance Expenses to the Director or Officer covered by said insurance.

<u>Article 10-3 – Definitions:</u> All capitalized terms used in ARTICLE X and not otherwise defined shall have the meaning set forth in Section 181.0871 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

ARTICLE XI CONFLICT OF INTEREST

<u>Section 11-1 – Disclosure of Possible Conflicts</u>: Each Director shall disclose to the Board any duality of interest or possible conflict of interest whenever duality or conflict pertains to a matter being considered by the Board.

<u>Section 11-2 - Minutes</u>: The minutes of the Board meeting involving any situation where a conflict has been identified shall reflect the disclosure of the conflict, the individual's limited involvement in the discussion of the topic, the abstention from voting and that a quorum was present after removal of the Director with the conflict.

<u>Section 11-3 – Statements of Policy:</u> The Association will have approved policies in place complying with the IRS's recommendation that 501 (c) (3) organizations have approved policies on Conflict of Interest, Whistleblowers and Record Retention.

ARTICLE XII DISSOLUTION CLAUSE

Section 12-1 Dissolution Clause: The corporation shall be nonstock and no dividends or pecuniary profits shall ever be declared or paid to the members thereof. In the event of the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

<u>Section 13-1 Amendments:</u> The power to alter, amend or repeal the By-Laws of the Association, or adopt new By-Laws shall be vested in the Board unless otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation. Such action may be taken at any Regular or Special Meeting of the Board. Notice of the proposed amendment, to include the suggested text of the change, shall be given in writing to all Directors at least twenty (20) days prior to the meeting at which the proposed change will be considered. The By-Laws may contain any provision for the regulation and management of the affairs of the Association not inconsistent with law or the Articles of Incorporation.
