## GLA seeks to fund Geneva Lake fire boat

### *'Moveable fire hydrant' would assist area departments*

At its annual meeting, the Board of the GLA discussed and later approved a resolution supporting an ad hoc committee of the GLA to investigate, raise funds and promote the concept of a fire boat for use on Geneva Lake.

After discussions with local fire departments, a presentation by the manufacturer, conversations with local municipalities and the Water Safety Patrol, the committee began its work to raise \$425,000 to fund the purchase of a fire boat and provide training for all fire departments surrounding Geneva Lake.

Ownership of the boat would rest with the Town of Linn, while access to the boat would be available for all local fire departments.

In a typical fire, the first fire engine on scene is responsible for locating and establishing a water supply. Having a fire boat will provide an unlimited water supply through a "movable hydrant," and resupplying fire trucks will be the primary function of the fireboat.

This resupply factor will assist both lake-shore and off-lake properties. The fire boat can refill two land tanker trucks at a rate of 1,500 gallons per minute thus assisting all area

fire departments with fire fighting both on and off the lake. A fire boat can be used to fight fires difficult to access from land as well as supply water to land-based apparatus fighting structure fires.

The fireboat is also equipped as a rescue boat complete with infrared equipment and can be used to assist the Water Safety Patrol and rapidly transfer victims to the launch ramp in Williams Bay for ambulance transport. Milwaukee and Chicago have fire boats and consider them critical pieces of their firefighting equipment.

The GLA has maintained, throughout its history, a deep concern for the welfare of the entire lake area. This project reflects the GLA's commitment to supporting all Geneva Lake communities by helping fire departments with their difficult work. The fire boat should become a valuable asset for all our communities.

Fund raising has begun, but placement of the order for the fire boat will only occur after at least 75% of the funds are raised. Any questions or requests for information can be directed to Dianna Colman at 262-245-9315 or Jim Smith at the GLA office.

# Yerkes FabLab project wins at County Fair

This year's Walworth County Fair 4H scale model division reserve champion was James Cudworth, 16, of Williams Bay. James' project was a 6 inch detailed scale model of Yerkes Observatory, made by building up layers of plastic in one of the new Yerkes FabLab 3-D printers. James' pilot FabLab project demonstrates what future FabLab students at Yerkes might expect to accomplish in the new Yerkes fabrication laboratory.

With the help of local benefactors and contributors, Yerkes is just beginning to create a FabLab which will be an extension of the existing Yerkes education programs, reaching High School and Middle School students interested in science, engineering and/or other technical careers.

FabLab was developed at MIT as a (build anything) vertically integrated teaching tool for student and adults. Independent FabLabs have been created throughout the U.S. and around the world. Students begin by learning simple CAD (computer aided design) programs, then apply the CAD designs through the next steps in completing the project which often includes manufacturing electronics and mechanical hardware.

It took James about 60 hours hand-measuring the Yerkes building

exterior including doors, windows and architectural features from ground to the roof, then creating a virtual exterior CAD blueprint, with the help of one of the Yerkes engineers. The mechanical design data from James' computer was captured on a "speed stick." The speed stick was plugged into the new FabLab 3-D printer where the data was read

and transferred; the "printing" of the model took about 7 hours.

Yerkes will begin with about a dozen pilot FabLab programs; each program introduced as equipment is funded by local contributors. Labor costs of Yerkes FabLab instructors will be saved by using professional engineers already on the Yerkes staff who donate their time to the program.

## **WDNR and GLLC working to reach accord**

While the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Geneva Lake Level Corporation were wrangling over the use of the Geneva Lake Dam, Mother Nature lent a hand to the lake with an abundance of rain in 2013, bringing levels back from the drought of 2012.

GLLC officials tell us that agreements have been reached in principle with the DNR, the details of which are being developed. We hope to publish some good news on that front in our next issue.

Our beautiful Geneva Lake is a source of enjoyment for residents and visitors alike, and an economic boon to Southeastern Wisconsin. Its level is critical to our enjoyment and financial well-being.


